### **Answer Key & Strategies**

- **Double Letters:** Look for repeated consonants in words like "committee" (mm/tt/ee).
- **Silent Letters:** Practice "knee" (k), "island" (s), and "wrist" (w). Highlight letters like 'k' in "knee" or 'b' in "doubt".
- Evil Words: Use mnemonics for "accommodation" (2 cots, 2 mattresses: Accommodation).

- **Plurals:** Remember rules: "city" → "cities", "box" → "boxes".
- Prefixes/Suffixes: Practice "un-" + "happy" = "unhappy", "care" + "-ful" = "careful".

Pro Tip: For evil words like "necessary", remember: "1 collar (C) and 2 sleeves (SS)"!
